The pace of change is speeding up into a frenzy as the new Building Code is implemented on July 1st, 2008 for an optional one year period. The new Code is based on the International Building Code and it utilizes national standards and rules as part of its requirements. It will also be updated on a three year cycle. This means that we all need to take a crash course to learn the new codes that affect our work. Fortunately the Building Department is presenting many aspects of the new code



as part of its Fourth Annual Construction Safety Week seminars. I urge all of my colleagues to attend.

 Many administrative changes are also occurring at the Building Department that will affect us directly. Special Inspectors will be required to register and provide proof of professional insurance. The Building Department is also trying to quantify the type of training and experience necessary. Unfortunately it goes beyond the requirements of the NYS licensing law for Professional Engineers and cites training that is not available here and certifications for technicians that is not applicable to engineers. Also as part of the administrative effort is the Special Enforcement Plan that has already been creating headlines.

Drywell Audit Program comes to Queens

Starting April 21, 2008, all Queens site engineers must notify the Buildings Department 48 hours prior to digging a sand

column and installing a drywell. Site engineers must call (212) 227-4416 to inform the Department of this pending work.

The Buildings Department will review drywell design drawings during plan exam to confirm Code compliance. The Department will impose Stop Work Orders if construction has already begun on drywell designs not approved.

The Buildings Department will have its inspectors randomly audit drywell sites to verify the completion of proper boring and/or percolation tests, sand column installation when specified, that the installation complies with the submitted plans; and that the drywell and piping installation comply with all applicable laws.

The Buildings Department's drywell review and site audits are part of an exploratory program to better assess proper installation and compliance. This program does not relieve registered architects or professional engineers of their responsibility to certify installations are done according to the Building Code when submitting a TR-1 Form to the Department.

ENR Award of Excellence goes to a Queens Engineer

Engineering News-Record magazine named Clyde N. Baker, Jr., P.E., Hon.M.ASCE the winner of its annual Award of Excellence, citing his vast skills and experience in "firming up the science of soil to support the skyscrapers of tomorrow." Mr. Baker is a Queens native who grew up in Flushing.

Over the past 50 years Mr. Baker has served as the geotechnical engineer on the major portion of high rise construction built in Chicago. He has also served as geotechnical engineer or consultant on seven of the 16 tallest buildings in the world, including the three tallest in Chicago – Sears, Hancock, and Amoco – and the current three tallest buildings in the world – the Petronas Towers in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and 101 Financial Center in Taipei, Taiwan.

This experience has earned Mr. Baker an international reputation in the design and construction of deep foundations. He has been a leader in using in-situ testing techniques correlated with past building performance to develop more efficient foundation designs. In the Chicago soil profile this has facilitated economical use of belled caissons on hard pan for major structures in the 60- to 70-story height range, such as Water Tower Place, 900 North Michigan, and AT&T buildings, which normally would have required extending caissons to rock at significant cost premium.

Legislative Update and Op-Ed Commentary

Update

NYSSPF conference At the in Rensselaerville, NY, Brian and I were told that Senate bill S3255 sponsored by Sen. Maltese of Queens and co-sponsored by Sens. Morahan, Padavan and Volker has been introduced into the NY State Senate. This bill, if enacted into law, would direct the NYC Dept. of Buildings to revoke the self certification privilege of any professional engineer or registered architect who files PROFESSIONAL SELF CERTIFIATION plans with the DOB that contain false information or are found not

to be in compliance with all applicable provisions of law.

Currently, the NYC DOB has the authorization to revoke the privilege of any licensed professional who provides false information or is found not to be in compliance with all applicable provisions of law in his documents. This non mandatory revocation was made into law last year during the last days of the legislative season. This year's bill, S3255 will make it mandatory for NYC DOB to revoke the prof. certification privilege.

The Queens Chapter of NYSSPE is against this bill. You may ask what we, the Society, are doing about this proposed legislation and helping to protect your license from politicians who haven't got a clue? This legislation is in its infancy and we are currently setting up meetings with several politicians in the Assembly and the Senate, including the sponsors of this bill (if they can face us) to better educate them and explain to them that this is a silly bill. Our Albany lobbyists and the State Chapter know our position and they are closely monitoring the progression of this bill. We are also in consultation with the AIA and the other NYSSPE chapters and we will soon discuss how to approach our options most efficiently. What can you do? Call your Assemblyman and Senator and tell them you are against Senate bill S3255.

Commentary

(The following commentary reflects my personal views and does not reflect the views of the Chapter:)

I don't know if the legislators of S3255 have noticed the other significant "issues" affecting the citizens of NY State that deserve their IMMEDIATE attention but I would tell the legislators this:

1. Gasoline is more than \$3.60 per gallon and affects so many people in so many different ways, from the clothes we buy to

the food we eat, high gasoline prices has a **<u>Negative effect</u>** on the NY economy, and our purchasing power as consumers. I would ask them, the legislators: *What are you doing about it?*

2. Exorbitant real estate taxes in Long Island and the rest of the State are driving people out of the county. Young people cannot afford homes in NY State and there are homeowners who have lost their homes through bank foreclosures. What are they doing about it?

3. Our infrastructure is deteriorating, our roads and bridges are a mess. Congestion pricing is being revived again and again probably because of the windfall that will be received from the federal gov't and another Minnesota catastrophe is imminent. *What are they doing about it?*

4.NY State is one of the highest tax states in the country. NYState is not a business friendly state due to high taxes and the cost of living in this region. *What are they doing about it?*

There are numerous other issues that can be listed but the answer to the four questions above is NOTHING-ABSOLUTELY NOTHING. The legislators have more important issues to pontificate and legislate.....such as professional self certification. What a joke!!!!!!

Call your legislators and let your voice be heard.

NEW YORK STATE SENATE INTRODUCER'S MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT submitted in accordance with Senate Rule VI. Sec 1

BILL NUMBER: S3255

SPONSOR: MALTESE

TITLE OF BILL:

An act to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to imposing sanctions upon professional engineers and registered architects that self-certify false or noncompliant building permit applications or plans

PURPOSE:

Imposes sanctions on professional engineers and registered architects that certify false or non compliant building permit applications or plans in NYC.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS:

Section 1: Adds a new section 27-143.1 to the Administrative Code of the city of New York to define self-certification as the submission to the department of a personal verification made by a professional engineer or registered architect that accompanies an application for approval of plans not containing any false information and in full compliance with the law. Therefore, allowing the department to forgo a full examination of any portion of such application or plans prior to approval.

B. Permanently revokes self-certification privileges for each professional engineer or registered architect that has submitted an application for approval of plans found by the department to contain false information.

JUSTIFICATION:

In efforts to reduce over development and continuing corruption in the construction industry, this legislation will prevent professional engineers from verifying their own plans. This legislation will tighten controls to eliminate any motivation to abuse the professional certification privilege. This privilege was once created to aide in the certification of minor plans. Self-certification was created to support homeowners that wanted to complete small plans on their homes, not for the creation or demolition of complete structures.

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY: New bill.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: None.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Immediately.

AN ACT to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to imposing sanctions upon professional engineers and registered architects that self-certify false or noncompliant building permit applications or plans

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The administrative code of the city of New York is amended 1 2 by adding a new section 27-143.1 to read as follows: § 27-143.1 Self-certification of application and plans. a. For the 3 4 purposes of this section, "self-certification" means the submission to 5 the department of a signed, personal verification made by a professional engineer or registered architect that accompanies an application for 6 approval of plans which attests that such application, plan or portions 7 thereof do not contain any false information and that such application, 8 9 plan or portions thereof are in full compliance with all applicable 10 provisions of law, thereby allowing the department to forgo a full exam-11 ination of any portion of such application or plans prior to approval. b. The department shall permanently revoke self-certification privi-12 13 leges for each professional engineer or registered architect found by 14 the department to have self-certified one previous application for 15 approval of plans that were found by the department to contain false 16 information or found not to be in compliance with all applicable 17 provisions of law. § 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 18
