Please forward your comments to me by next Monday and remember the public comment period ends on July 8, 2010. During the conference we had an MCPC (five NYC chapter presidents) meeting and we discussed the proposed amendment. The five chapters object to the current agency structure language that will be construed as allowing Incs./general business corporations from performing these inspections by hiring a professional engineer as their director. This will lead to rubber stamping. Special inspections are the practice of engineering and

in accordance with NYS law we believe that only professional engineers (sole proprietor), engineering firms with a certificate of authorization and the handful of grandfathered engineering Incs. are the only entities that are allowed to perform these inspections. One other major concern with the proposed amendment is trades people, ie. plumbers, fire alarm contractors, etc. signing off on a handful of inspections. Some of these inspections involve life safety and we are adamantly opposed to them signing off on For example, plumbers, according to the these inspections. amendment will now be able to signoff on drywells, detention tanks, standpipes, etc. There is more to drywells then just pipes. Do plumbers know what 34-inch crushed stone is and where it goes? I don't think so. Joe Pasaturo, PE, NYSSPE, President of the Staten Island Chapter and MCPC is drafting a letter to the DOB's Director Alan Price, PE summarizing our concerns. A letter to the City of New York's Corporation Counsel (law department) has been sent by the state chapter of NYSSPE informing them of our There are major changes to the special inspection requirements as shown in APPENDIX A and I urge everyone who performs special inspections to read the proposed amendment and Appendix A.

Meeting Minutes

State Engineering & Land Surveying Board meeting-Friday 6-11-10

The board reviewed the following issues during the public part of the meeting:

- 1. Question: When a municipality or agency requires that an engineer provide a signed a sealed document, is all of the work needed to produce that document considered to be the practice of engineering?
- 2. Special Inspections: NYC DOB is implementing the final rules. State board is sending a clarification to DOB. NYS DOE is working to establish legislation for all professions where local municipalities are by passing state law. Letter previously sent to DOB that all special inspections are considered the practice of engineering.
- 3. Discussed energy audit program being implemented by NYC may result in illegal practice.
- 4. Committee Reports 25% non professional ownership will not make it through the legislature. The medical profession strongly opposes this bill. There may also be unintended consequences as a result. Condominium law involving real property law and property subdivision falls under the practice of Land Surveying. The proposed definition of Land Surveying is very broad and includes planning, which is considered the practice of engineering.

MCPC Meeting Friday 6-11-10

The Municipal Chapter Presidents Council (of the five boroughs) considered the following issues:

- 1. Issuing letter to DOB in support of the NYSDOE position that special inspections are the practice of engineering.
- 2. Discussed the Expediter issue and the illegal practice of engineering.
- 3. Presidents are encouraged to attend the commissioner's DOB EAR (Engineers & Architects Roundtable) and is held monthly.
- 4. Reviewed and commented on the proposed rules for Progress Inspections and the Energy Code requirements for design and Progress Inspections.

PEPP Meeting Saturday - 6-12-10

The Professional Engineers in Private Practice division met with the Professional Engineers in Construction (PEC) to discuss the following issues:

- 1. Reviewed the new structure of special inspection agencies in NYC.
- 2. Requested clarification from NYS Board of Engineers and Land Surveyors on the following question, does the requirement of an engineer's signature and seal by a municipality also define the work leading up to the form also is the practice of engineering?
- 3. Accreditation of special inspection agencies was investigated by PIE as a potential accreditation agency. PIE does not appear to be capable at this time due to the limited market of only Class 1 Agencies requiring accreditation.
- 4. The NYS energy code will require energy audits that require a PE or RA. Additional qualifications may also be needed.
- 5. Continue to file complaints with the OPD against unlicensed individuals as well as fellow professionals that abuse their privileges or practice unprofessionally.

NYSSPE Board of Directors Meeting - Saturday 6-12-10

This is a summary of the meeting highlights:

- 1. NYPE magazine will no longer be issued quarterly after this year. It will only be issued for the June Meeting, with the current membership roster. It will be replaced by the email news letters currently sent out every week.
- 2. The state has lost 200 members from last year and is experiencing an operating loss as a result.
- 3. Marc Kriss, our council and lobbyist, discussed the current pending legislation.

 NYS has serious deficits. Bills advocated include QBS, modifying corporate forms of practice to include 25% non-professional ownership and the geologists bill which allows engineers to practice geology but geologists can not practice engineering.
- 4. The National Society may allow state only or national only memberships in the future. A vote will be held at the national meeting this year.
- 5. Reports were given by FEE, PIE and STEM.
- 6. Reports by the practice divisions, PEG, PEI, PEC, PEPP
- 7. New Business: The board endorsed Angelo Santabarbara, PE, who is running for office in the NYS Assembly. The endorsement was to promote community involvement of all of our members.
